Grand visions or incremental improvements: how do we embed viability and 'future-proof' our towns and cities?



This event will explore key issues:

- Analysising town centre 'spend by mode'
- Post-Portas review: real places or reality TV? What have we learned?
- Developing public transport: new attitudes to car ownership and use
- Mapping, wayfinding and future urban information systems
- Future urban mobility: how movement can add to place quality



The current spotlight on successful high streets has been focused on short-term schemes such as Portas Pilots, leaving local authorities to make sense of a range of overlapping and ad hoc opportunities. Are the real issues being sidelined?

Movement to, from and within urban centres has always been key to their success – and will continue to be so as living and travel patterns evolve. In this event, we go back to basics and examine what we really know about how we use our urban centres, and how they might function in future.

What do we actually know about travel by modes other than the car? Is the importance of travel by other modes downplayed due to the lack of a credible evidence base? Do we know what policy levers are effective in encouraging positive behaviour change, and in supporting better decision-making amongst risk-averse policy makers?
