


Managing freight vehicles through Kent Response questionnaire



Introduction

This questionnaire forms part of a consultation Highways England is conducting on behalf of HM Government into the provision of an off-road lorry area near the Port of Dover and Eurotunnel terminal to help reduce or remove the need to queue lorries on the M20 in a procedure known as 'Operation Stack'.

We are consulting widely on our proposals because Operation Stack affects both those living and working locally but also those travelling to or through Kent.


